THE SEASON OF EASTER

Because Jesus lives we know that our sins have all been paid for and our eternal salvation won. We can live our lives here on this earth with the confidence that our living Lord is always with us and that someday he will take us to be with him in the never-ending joy of heaven. For the seven weeks of Easter we celebrate the resurrection of Christ until the season reaches its climax on the 50th day, Pentecost.

OUR THEME FOR TODAY

He lives to call me to live for him. This Sunday's lessons expand on a truth touched on last Sunday and teach us that love for our risen Lord means obedience to his commands. Filled with thankfulness for the salvation that God has so fully and freely provided in Christ and empowered by his Holy Spirit, whom we received in Baptism, we strive to faithfully put to use all God's gifts for the good of his kingdom. The Prayer of the Day sets the tone: "Put your Spirit in us to think those things that are true and long for those things that are good."

DIVINE SERVICE II

Lutherans believe that the gospel is not only the good news that Jesus has saved sinners, but also the power God uses to create and strengthen faith in Jesus. Thus Lutheran worship places the gospel in central focus in an order of service called the liturgy. In message and meal (Holy Communion), in specially selected Bible readings, and in carefully crafted songs, prayers, and confessions, the liturgy points to Jesus as the Savior of all.

FIRST LESSON

Acts 17:22-31

²² Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: "Men of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious. ²³ For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: to an unknown god. Now what you worship as something unknown I am going to proclaim to you.


²⁴ "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by hands. ²⁵ And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything, because he himself gives all men life and breath and everything else. ²⁶ From one man he made every nation of men, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he determined the times set for them and the exact places where they should live. ²⁷ God did this so that men would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸ 'For in him we live and move and have our being.' As some of your own poets have said, 'We are his offspring.'

²⁹ "Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone–an image made by man's design and skill. ³⁰ In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. ³¹ For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising him from the dead."

⁵ This greeting has deep roots in Christian worship and marks the beginning of the Word section and the Sacrament section of the service.

- MC At the works of your hands, O Lord, I lift up my voice in song; I sing for joy.




SECOND LESSON

1 John 3:13-18

¹³ Do not be surprised, my brothers, if the world hates you. ¹⁴ We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love our brothers. Anyone who does not love remains in death. ¹⁵ Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life in him.

¹⁶ This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. ¹⁷ If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? ¹⁸ Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. ¹⁸ I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹ Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. ²¹ Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. SERMON

Acts 17:22-31

MAKE KNOWN THE UNKNOWN GOD

NICENE CREED⁷

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven. was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

⁷ Public confession is faith's response to God's saving Word. Christians composed the Nicene Creed in the fourth century to defend the Bible's teachings that both Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are true God, equal to the Father in one eternal, undivided Trinity.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,

the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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THE SACRAMENT



In the Lord's Supper we receive the true body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ along with bread and wine. In this communion God gives us forgiveness that we can touch and taste. It's the same forgiveness that the pastor pronounces to you at the beginning of the service. You are forgiven!

The Lord's Supper makes a second statement. It says, "We are perfectly united in everything that we believe and do!" We don't know if this type of bond exists with our guests, but we are eager to establish it. Thus we ask that those guests, who are not members of a WELS or ELS congregation, only observe the Lord's Supper today and meet personally with our pastor if you desire to receive the Sacrament in the future.



¹⁰ Jesus took bread and gave thanks (Matthew 26:26).


WORDS OF INSTITUTION¹¹





¹²Jesus is God's Lamb (Agnus Dei), who was offered as a sacrifice for sin once for all.



ASCENSION DAY SERVICE AT ZION MAY 25TH


